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Writing Intensive Requirement: Course Title/# ENGL 401 _____ WI course in major _____ 600/700-level WI course _____ other WI course _____	All undergraduates are required to complete four "writing- intensive" courses which must include English 401 (First-Year Writing) and three additional "writing- intensive" courses, one of which must be in the student's major and one must be at the 600-level or above. A student may take a 600/700 level WI course in the major but must still have a total of four WI courses.
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\*One of the two Sciences (BS, PS) must have a lab.

\*\*No credit if two or more years in high school.

\*\*\*May be taken to fulfill a World Culture requirement if an intermediate-level course is used.

Note: Psychology majors MAY NOT use Psychology courses except PSYC 402 (see next page) to satisfy Discovery requirements.

**PSYCHOLOGY MAJOR**

Note: Students must complete 44 credits in Psychology courses with grades of C- or better and an overall gpa in the major of 2.0. PSYC 402 may be taken to fill Discovery or a major requirement, but not both. If taken for the Quantitative Reasoning requirement, students must take another PSYC course that is eligible for major credit. Students with a first major in psychology may not use any psychology course to fulfill the Discovery requirements. The Psychology Department does not accept other department statistics courses toward the psychology major. Students who have taken a statistics course other than PSYC 402 must pass a competency exam in order to register for PSYC 502. Transfer students must complete at least 24 credits in Psychology at UNH/UNHM. Of the four 700-level courses required for the major, at least three must be taken at UNH.

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To make up credit deficiency if needed:				
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The **capstone requirement** is completed during the student's senior year. Students choose one of three options to meet the Capstone Requirement in the Psychology Major. First, students can complete a 4-credit independent study project and present the results at the UNHM Undergraduate Research Conference. Second, students can enroll in Internship (PSYC 793), which includes both a closely supervised work experience in a human services agency and a weekly seminar. Third, students can take a designated Capstone Seminar which explores advanced topics in an area of psychology. Note that both Psychology 793 and a designated capstone seminar may also fulfill a 700-level major requirement.

**Note: Not all courses listed are offered in Manchester, but are available in Durham.**

\* PSYC 522 is not a prerequisite for a 700 level course. Students who have taken PSYC 522 may not earn credit for PSYC 722. PSYC 522 may not be used for a Group I 500-level course if the student transfers to Durham.

\*\*PSYC 702 and PSYC 705 may be substituted for a group I or group II course, but they may not both be used to fill the same group. The following courses cannot be used toward the major: PSYC 444, 595, 795 A-L, 797, 799

\*\*\* A maximum of four credits of PSYC 793 may be applied to the 700-level requirement in the major. However, additional credits of PSYC 793 (beyond 4 credits) may be used to fulfill the 44 credit requirement in the major. If a student has fulfilled his or her distribution requirements in the major, then 591, 795, 797, or 799 may be used to fulfill the 44 credit requirement.

\*\*\*\*PSYC 793 and designated capstone seminar courses may also fulfill a 700-level course requirement
