What is a Poster Presentation?

- ◆ The visual representation of your research.
- ◆ An opportunity to discuss your research.
- ◆ Clear, concise and concept-based.
- ◆ A logical progression of ideas.
- ◆ An effective balance of text and graphics.
- ◆ **Not** merely a displayed conference paper.

Planning your poster

- ◆ Review your research.
- ◆ Identify your central message.
- ◆ Consider your audience.
- ◆ Determine space and size requirements.
- ◆ Prepare a timetable.
- ◆ Use a concept map to organize materials.

Creating your poster

◆ Layout

- Organize sections with headings.
- Balance text and graphics.
- Use white space effectively.
- Remember “reader gravity”.
- Keep it simple.
- Format text with Microsoft PowerPoint.

Creating your poster

◆ Graphics

- Choose graphs appropriately.
- Label all graphics.
- Size matters, legible from 3-5 feet away.
- Use clipart to add interest if complementary to subject.
- Keep graphics simple and clean.

Creating your poster

◆ Text

- Minimize text, use relevant images.
- Use active voice.
- Use phrases, not complete sentences.
- Do not use more than 2 font types.
- Go large – **at least** 36 point for titles and 24 point for text.
- Do not use all UPPER CASE type.

Creating your poster

◆ Colors

- Light background with dark letters.
- No more than 2-3 colors throughout.
- Use color to emphasize and differentiate.
- Overly bright colors tire the reader.
- Consider colorblindness issues.

Creating your poster

◆ Evaluate

- Edit non-relevant text and graphics.
- Check spelling.
- Ask peers for honest feedback.
- Be critical.
- Try other layout patterns.
- Edit, edit, edit.

Presenting your poster

- ◆ Arrive on time and dress neatly.
- ◆ Prepare a 2-3 minute oral presentation using the poster as a guide.
- ◆ Allow people to view your poster before leading them through it.
- ◆ Provide a handout with the details of your research.
- ◆ Enjoy yourself – you've already done the hard work.
