ENGL 401 _____ WI course in major _____ 600/700-level WI course _____ other WI course _____	All undergraduates are required to complete four "writing-intensive" courses, which must include English 401 (First-Year Writing) and three additional "writing-intensive" courses, one of which must be in the student's major and one must be at the 600-level or above.
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A student may take a 600/700-level WI course in the major but must still have a total of 4 WI courses.

*** May be taken to fulfill a Group 5 General Education Requirement if an intermediate-level course is used.

NOTE: English majors may not use ENGL 515 to satisfy General Education Requirements.

English Majors may use ENGL 505 or 581 to satisfy General Education or major requirements, but not both.

English major – 40 credits

The major requirements consist of a minimum of 10 courses (40 credits) including Engl 419 (previously numbered 519) Engl 787, two 500-level courses (or one 500-level and 405), six courses numbered 600 and above (including 787) and one additional 500, 600, or 700-level class of your choosing. To count towards the English major, grades must be C- or above **EXCEPT ENGL 419 WHICH MUST BE COMPLETED WITH A MINIMUM GRADE OF C.** In selecting these courses, students must meet the following distribution requirements:

Please consult with your advisor if you have questions about other courses that might fulfill this requirement.				
LITERATURE SINCE 1800 Two post-1800 literature courses. Either two advanced courses, or one advanced course, and one of the following: ENGL 514, 515, or 516. Choose from: 608, 609, 650*, 681, 690, 714, 739, 742, 743, 744, 745, 746, 747, 748, 749, 769, 770, 771, 772, 773, 774, 777, 782, 784, 786. Please consult with your advisor if you have questions about other courses that might fulfill this requirement.				
FIVE ENGLISH COURSES from the 500, 600 and 700 level courses. One of these MUST be the capstone course, ENGL 787, Senior Seminar. ENGL 620, Applied Experience, and ENGL 788, Senior Honors (previously numbered ENGL 695), cannot be used to satisfy the upper level requirement. ENGL 787, Senior Seminar				
In addition, students must take one course that focuses on diversity in race, ethnicity, religion, gender or class, and theories concerning them. Choose from: 517, 540, 581, 608, 609, 685, 738, 739, 740, 693R, 797R, 797-Jewish American Writers. This course may count toward the ten courses described above.
