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<b>Capstone Requirement (4 credits) – taken in senior year</b>

		<p>Students may fulfill the capstone requirement with one of the following:</p> <p><b>PSYC 793 Internship:</b> This will count towards fulfilling the capstone and a group II 700 level psychology course. By taking PSYC 793 Internship, the capstone will be considered fulfilled.</p> <p><b>PSYC 795 Independent Study:</b> Students can designate a 4 credit independent study as their capstone experience. The capstone designation form must be filled out and students will be registered for PSYC 798 Capstone, a 0 credit course to reflect the capstone experience is fulfilled. This can count towards the capstone and as a 402 replacement course.</p> <p><b>One 700 level course designated as capstone.</b> A capstone designated 700 level course will count towards fulfilling the capstone and a 700 level course. The capstone designation form must be filled out and students will be registered for PSYC 798 Capstone, a 0 credit course to reflect the capstone experience is fulfilled. You may take any 700 level Psychology course in your senior year (90+ completed credits) for Capstone credit. See the catalog for additional capstone guidelines.</p>

<b>Courses to make up for credit deficit (if needed)</b>

Program Notes:

- All students must have at least a 2.0 cumulative GPA in order to graduate.
- Senior Residency: students must complete their last 32 credits of the degree at UNH.
- Students may take any undergraduate courses as electives in order to earn a minimum of 128 credits.
- Students must complete major courses with grades of C- or better and an overall GPA in the major of 2.0.
- Transfer students must complete at least 24 credits in Psychology at UNH or UNH Manchester.

Foreign Language Policy:

- Students who completed 2 or more years of a foreign language in high school cannot take the elementary level courses. If 5 or more years have elapsed since last taking the language, you may be able to take elementary level courses. Contact Academic Advising for more information.
